RAF war hero is remembered with gift from town museum

THE nephew of a fallen war

THE nephew of a fallen war hero has been presented with replica model of the plane his uncle was killed in.

Newark Air Museum made the poignant presentation to commemorate the life of Sergeant Norris Mervyn Harrison, who was shot down in his plane while he was returning from a bombing raid over Germany during the Second World War.

War.

He was just 19 years old at the time he was killed, and the plane he was travelling in was a Halifax Mark III bomber from the 76 Squadron of the Royal Air Force

A model of this plane made by Terence Fox, of the Air-frames Studios in Macclesfield, was given by the museum to Sergeant Harrison's nephew Mile Harrison of Gibb. Sergeant Harrison's nephew Mike Harrison of Clifton Road, Gedling.

Holme-on-Spalding Moor, in Yorkshire and flown over to raid the town of Karlsruhe in Germany on the night of April 24, 1944.

He was travelling back to safety and was just north of Cambridge when his plane was attacked and crashed.

All the crew with the exception of the rear gunner were killed.

killed.

The gunner who survived the crash was Flight Sergeant John Anderson (1573409), who was rescued from his turret by the local fire brigade, suffering from a broken femur and abrasions to the scale.

After the presentation, Mr Harrison, 54, said: "It was quite a moving day and, as the presentation ended, we were treated to an exceptionally low, extremely fast, fly-past by a pair of Tornados directly over-head.
